To register for homeschooling in Florida, you must submit a signed [Notice of Intent \(LOI\)](#) to your county's school district superintendent within 30 days of starting. The notice should include the child's name, birthdate, address, and parent signature. It is recommended to send this via certified mail or through the district's online portal.

Key Steps to Register

- File Notice of Intent: Within 30 days of starting, send a written notice of intent to your local district's home education office.
- Withdraw from Current School: If your child is currently in a public school, you must officially withdraw them after filing the intent to homeschool.
- Maintain Records: Keep a portfolio (log) of educational activities and samples of your child's work for at least two years.
- Annual Evaluation: You must submit an annual evaluation for each child to the school district one year after your initial filing.

Methods for Submission

- District Website: Search for your county's school district website, specifically the "Home Education" or "Homeschool" department, to find specific forms or online portals.
- Email or Mail: Many districts allow you to email or mail the letter of intent directly.
- Notification: You will receive a confirmation letter or email from the district, which serves as your proof of registration.
